Written Tests: Each ES is responsible for writing their own test. However, I MAY have a college student experienced with Sci Oly available to write a test for a \$50 stipend. LET ME KNOW ASAP IF YOU WOULD LIKE ME TO CHECK (please provide your team name and your event name).

ESUS events with an event score sheet (available on the National website) will receive a populated score sheet prior to tournament day. You will want to add it to a laptop to score your event at the tournament.
